President's Report

What a year!! 2024 brought exciting opportunities to share, new professional publications, partnership initiatives and a renewed passion to make a difference for young women with breast cancer.

The onsite Fore for Shan golf tournament was a huge success in Temiskaming, and the first ever Team Shan Pickleball tournament in Huntsville was also well received. Both tournament sponsorships and activities along with third party events and donations provided the funding to host our mini breast cancer campaigns in seven (9) locations across Ontario during the fall. Sites included London, Woodstock, Delhi, Welland, Peterborough, Orillia, Muskoka, Timiskaming, and Thunder Bay.

The QUAD Niagara ATV Club supported Team Shan with a very special breast cancer event in Niagara. Team Shan hosted a mini campaign this fall and will return in 2025 with a multi-faceted awareness campaign to reach young women in Niagara Region.

Team Shan can only facilitate breast cancer awareness and education activities through community support and generous donations. Our thanks to the special supporters and third party fundraisers who make our efforts to reach young women with their breast cancer risk and breast health information possible.

I was honoured to be invited as a Distinguished Speaker at the first International Conference on Young Women's Breast Cancer and Health held in Lisbon, Portugal. The conference brought global breast cancer in young women researchers, health care professionals, advocates, and survivors together in an effort to share hope for the future. I also presented on Shan's Story and Team Shan at the AYA Cancer Global Congress in Melbourne, Australia.

Early detection advocacy continued with my Journal of Young Women's Breast Cancer and Health publication entitled "Addressing the Challenge of Delayed Diagnosis Due to Age-related Disparities in Young Women's Breast Cancer Care" publication in October.

Team Shan continues to support regional and national projects to make a difference in AYA cancer awareness and education. One milestone was the completion of the 10 AYA cancer research priorities for Canada. These partnerships will help increase early detection and improve outcomes for young women diagnosed in Canada.






Diagnostic Delays
