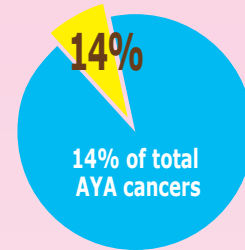
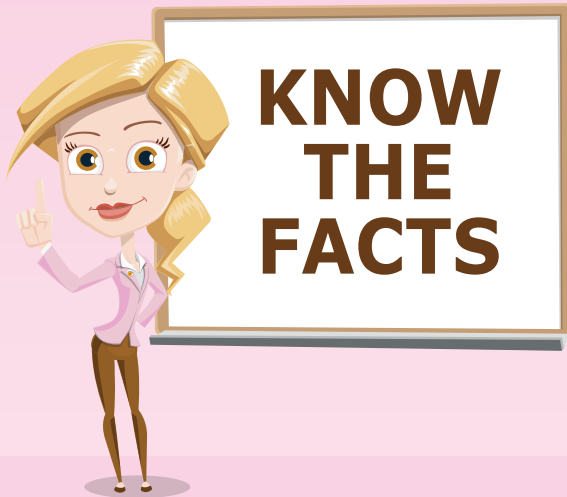
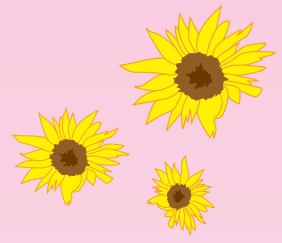

Breast Cancer in young women is the leading cause of AYA cancer deaths!

BREAST CANCER IS THE MOST COMMON CANCER IN YOUNG WOMEN (15-39 years)

- higher AYA cancer incidence among young women is due to disproportionately high numbers of breast and cervical cancer (Wen et al)
- highest proportion of categorized AYA deaths and disability-adjusted life years (DALYs) are attributed to breast cancer (Wen et al)



WHY EARLY DETECTION MATTERS!

- young women are disproportionately diagnosed late compared to older women (40 plus)
- young women are more likely to be diagnosed with advanced breast cancer
- young women experience more aggressive disease with lower survival rates
- when diagnosed early there is usually a better chance of successful treatment
- earlier diagnosis can occur when young women report unusual breast changes to their health care provider
